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*February is Library Lovers' Month...at public, academic, and school libraries! How can you show your affection for the Woodlands Library?*

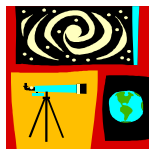

## Love and Logic in the Library

Love and Logic is the idea that you can help raise your children in a **more loving and less stressful** way by allowing love to help your child grow from mistakes and allowing logic to help your child live with the consequences of his/her choices.

These ideas fit right in with my belief that **children are capable of being responsible for their own library materials** and should live with the consequences if an item is lost or damaged. (This is playing out in an interesting fashion in my own family right now since I have a kindergartener who seems to have permanently misplaced her library book.) If necessary, I work with children and their families to design a schedule to **help the child pay** for an item. Children who have had to pay for their own lost or damaged item seem less likely to need to do so in the future!

We have a great selection in the Woodlands Library of Love and Logic resources for parents and others to borrow. If you'd like to read a Love and Logic book, listen to an audio presentation (they're very funny), or watch a video/DVD presentation stop by the Woodlands Library between 8:00 am and 3:00 pm on school days.
